
## IPP/ISEG INDEX

THE BUDGET WATCH SCIENTIFIC ADVISORY COUNCIL ANALYZES THE STATE BUDGET 2020 FROM THE PERSPECTIVE OF 10 BUDGETARY RESPONSIBILITY PRINCIPLES

- Transparency, rigor and analysis of sensitivity
- Consideration trade-offs between policy objectives
- Political responsibility
- Explanation of financial flows between public administrations and the Public Business Sector
- Budgetary balances consistent with the sustainable level of public debt
- Adequate information on public X.8 investment projects, contracts and Public-Private Partnerships
- Control of public consumption expenditure and health expenditur<u>e</u>
- Solidarity between the different levels of administration and subsectors of the central administration
- Control of social security expenditure
- Incorporation of improvements in the budgetary process


